
Plant Crib



LUDWIGIA ' KENTIANA | L. PALUSTRIS

Ludwigia plants appearing outside the restricted native range of the very rare L. palustris should be checked to see if they are the widely available horticultural aquarium plant L. \times kentiana (L. palustris \times L. repens). Specimens are easiest to name when fresh. Petals detach quickly after opening, so examine buds (\times 20 lens).

	Ludwigia palustris (L.) Ell.	Ludwigia × kentiana E. J. Clement
Petals	Absent	(1-)4, minute (c. 0.5 mm), spathulate, cream
Fruit	Swells to sub-rotund shape, soon revealing 4 dark green longitudinal rupture lines	Narrow, long, uniformly pale green not swelling (i.e. sterile)
Bracteoles	Minute, up to 0.6 mm	1-1.5 mm, some reaching mid-ovary position
