BSBI CHESHIRE RECORDING NEWSLETTER – 2008

2007 started in SJ68H at Lumb Brook Wood where we added 165 including Dryopteris affinis ssp affinis & borreri, and Polystichum setiferum. In SJ66E Newchurch we walked along the old railway to the flooded sand quarries and over to the bog where Andromeda, and Vaccinium oxycoccus were still surviving. Along the way a new site for Filago vulgaris was pleasing along with much Ornithopus perpusillus and Cerastium semidecandrum. 189 additions to the tetrad were made. In SJ57B at Manley we added 185 of which Triglochin palustre, Lepidium heterophyllum, Carex binervis, and Umbilicus were noteworthy. The old railway (now an international walkway) and canal at Dunham Massey (SJ78P) added 171. Pilosella praealta was on the railway, huge Osmundas and an unexpected Hydrangea macrophylla were by the canal along with Bryonia dioica, not common in east Cheshire. A surprising field of Ammi majus was the highlight in SJ76W with Frangula alnus and Sanguisorba major in the hedgerow. 163 were added. Replete with lunch, the afternoon in SJ76V yielded 174 new records including Myosoton, Stachys x ambigua, Potentilla x mixta, and Agrostis castellana. The highlight of the year was the visit to Baddiley Mere (SJ55V) despite wind and rain! Rumex maritimus was plentiful along with hybrids with R. conglomeratus and obtusifolius, the latter spotted by Martyn Stead, new to VC58. The mere seemed somewhat nutrient rich which no doubt explained the huge Bidens cernua var radiata. 127 taxa were seen. Finally the hills east of Tintwistle (SK09J) were even wetter and windier and we were glad to retreat after seeing that Wahlenbergia and Scutellaria minor were doing well. We only added 7 species but did get Linaria repens in SK091.

Elsewhere notable records were Dipsacus laciniatus, Anthemis austriaca, Calla palustris, and good safe colonies of Carex elongata and Bromus racemosus.

Park in layby at SK035979. If the weather is better than in 2007, we will make for the Coombes Clough area, but record the reservoir edge if not.


Saturday 6th September 2pm Tiverton
