


# **BSBI IRISH FIELD PROGRAMME 2017**

# SATURDAY 13th MAY - NORTH-EAST GALWAY - GLENAMADDY AREA (v.c. H17)

Many people are daunted by the terms used in botanical keys. This workshop aims to demystify and explain the terms used in botanical keys so that it is possible to track down a species definitively rather than just flick through an illustrated flora.
