

PREFACE

County Down is distinguished among Irish counties by its relatively diverse and interesting flora, as a consequence of its range of habitats and long coastline. It is also distinguished by having been the subject, together with its neighbours of Antrim and Londonderry, of three county floras, published at intervals of some 50 years as the *Flora of the North-East of Ireland*. It is therefore one of the better known counties of Ireland, floristically speaking. The third edition of this *Flora* was edited by Paul Hackney, who was the vice-county recorder for county Down for the Botanical Society of the British Isles until 1999 . Since then, Graham Day has taken on this mantle, and has recorded actively for the *New Atlas of the British & Irish Flora*, as well for this Register.

The Register differs from the *Flora of the North-East of Ireland* in that it gives much more detail concerning many fewer species. It concentrates on those which are rare, on either the national or the local scale or both. In doing so, it draws attention to many species which need to be the subject of conservation action, whether directed at the species themselves or at the habitats they occupy, if they are to survive and flourish in the county. It also draws attention to some species of which the extent and credibility of the supposed records is questionable, and where it would be advisable to concentrate on verification of the current distribution.

The Register is thus a major contribution to the study of biodiversity in county Down and, as a trendsetter, to that of Ireland as a whole. More importantly, perhaps, it should also facilitate the conservation of biodiversity, and help to bring about activities designed to protect those plant species which are most at risk.

INTRODUCTION

This register has been produced as part of a national Botanical Society of the British Isles (BSBI) initiative to highlight plants whose scarcity is a cause for concern. It is intended that the Register be up-dated at regular intervals to include new records.




Figure 1. Vice-county H38 Down (modified from *Praeger 1901*)

- ☐ It includes only species within the vice-county boundary for county Down (H38) (Figure 1).
- ☐ It includes native and some introduced higher plants. Casual species are listed separately.
- □ It lists plant species and some hybrids that are currently scarce, rare and extinct within the Down vice-county, and those that are protected under international or national legislation, but are not necessarily rare or scarce in the vice-county.
- ☐ It does not include lower plants, as the distribution of these is inadequately known in county Down.
- ☐ Also included are plant species that have been recorded in error.

The criteria used for inclusion in the Register are:

- □ Listed/occurring in EC Habitats and Species Directive Annex IIb, IVb or Vb; or Appendix I of the Bern Convention or Appendix I or II of CITES.
- □ Listed in the British or Irish Red Data Books for vascular plants (Curtis & McGough 1988; Wigginton 1999).
- □ Listed in Schedule 8 of the Wildlife (Northern Ireland) Order 1985 or the Flora Protection Order 1987 (Republic of Ireland).
- □ Listed as Northern Ireland Priority Species or Northern Ireland Species of Conservation Concern.
- □ Native species formerly occurring in the vice-county but now extinct.
- □ Species occurring in 10 or less of 1km squares in the vice- county (Scarce).
- □ Species occurring in 3 or less of 1km squares in vice-county (Rare).
- □ Non-native species that are of biological, historical or cultural interest.

CONSERVATION LEGISLATION CATEGORIES

Plant species may be protected under international and national legislation. Internationally protected species are listed in CITES, the Bern Convention, IUCN Red Data lists and EU Habitats Directive. In Northern Ireland, all wild plants are given some measure of protection under the Wildlife (N.I.) Order, 1985. Fifty-six species, listed in Schedule 8, parts 1 and 2, (Table 1 below) are given special protection.

The order has the effect that, unless you have a licence, you may not:

intentionally pick, uproot or destroy any wild plants listed in the schedule, or even collect their flowers and seeds; sell these plants or their seeds if taken from the wild; uproot any wild plants intentionally, except on your own land or with permission.

In March 2004, the list of Northern Ireland Priority Species and Northern Ireland Species of Conservation Concern, was published by Environment & Heritage Service on their web site at www.ehsni.gov.uk/natural/biodiversity/priority_species.shtml. The criteria for inclusion on this list are detailed on this web site.

Species that are listed under the Flora Protection Order, 1987 (Republic of Ireland) are also included. In addition, a number of UK Priority species are found in Northern Ireland, of which five have been recorded from county Down. These are listed in Table 2 (see below).

Species are listed in taxonomic order. The Latin and English names of vascular plants used are those in the *Field Flora of the British Isles* (Stace 1999). Non-native species may be classified as archaeophyte or neophyte, dependent on their introduction pre- or post- 1500AD.

The conservation status and status with regard to protection under legislation for each species may be given in the header line of the species using one or more of the following codes:

WO Wildlife Order 1985 (Northern Ireland)
FPO Flora Protection Order 1987 (Republic of Ireland)
WCA Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (Great Britain)

- **3**. Any non-native taxon which has been long established in 3 or fewer sites, or which is of special biological, historical or cultural interest.

For each species there may be a brief account of its current status, possible cause of changes in population or distribution, and whether it is native or not.

Records listed after the taxon accounts cover all stations at which the taxon has been recorded. A prolonged absence is normally assumed to indicate extinction. Grid references for each species are given as six figures where possible. Recorders are identified by name. The records are ordered by grid reference (10km).

An attractive scarce perennial native found on heaths and moorland. It has been found most frequently in the Mourne Mountains where it was first reported before 1744 (Harris 1744). It has suffered losses from mainly agricultural pressure including overgrazing, burning and improvement. It is no longer present at Conlig due to building development. This species appears to be still declining, presumably from over-grazing and is vulnerable to further losses.

A scarce native submerged aquatic perennial found in nutrient-poor water including loughs and a reservoir. It was first recorded in 1899 at Lough Neagh, but has not been seen at this site since. It has been found mainly in and close to the Mourne Mountains. There has been an improvement in recording this species, but it has declined, especially in lowland sites, probably due to eutrophication. This species is secure at upland stations, but is vulnerable at most others because of sensitivity to agricultural eutrophication.

A perennial hybrid of riversides, wet banks and rocks, which has maintained itself vegetatively for long periods (perhaps many centuries) at its various sites. There is no correlation with the modern distribution of the *Equisetum variegatum* parent, and only a weak correlation with the distribution of *E. hyemale*. The hybrid shows no real tendency to spread, and in places has been reduced to tiny remnants (J. Harron pers. comm.).

A small rare native prostrate perennial that was first found in county Down at Tyrella in 1979. Its distribution is coastal and apparently increasing. The Tyrella site is currently protected, so the population is secure at least at this site. The Portavogie site is subject to dumping, and seems threatened by vegetative succession. The Killough site was visited in 2000, and the species was not found. This species is vulnerable because of the small number of stations at which it is found.

A rare, striking, native perennial found in damp shady places usually by stream banks. First found at Tollymore in 1865, but is now extinct at this site. It is present at only one station now, where tiny patches grow in the bushy valley of a stream where basalt rock outcrops. This species has declined and the population appears to be vulnerable as it will be lost if the habitat is changed in any way. It is rare in Ireland, nearly always surviving as fragmented patches in exceptional habitats.

A scarce, tiny, charming, native deciduous fern of moist pasture, fen and dune slacks. It was first recorded in 1864 and has had a mainly eastern distribution in the county. It is declining, having been lost from many sites due to agricultural and building development. This species is vulnerable to further losses and can only be regarded as secure at sites such as Killard NNR where it is protected.

A rare, distinctive, small native fern found on heaths and upland pastures. It was first found in 1806 at Scrabo Hill. It is easily overlooked, and was once locally frequent, mainly in the east of the county, but has suffered many losses as a result of agricultural improvement and invasion by scrub. The population of this species in the county is critically endangered.

A scarce, small, inconspicuous, native, deciduous, perennial arctic-alpine species of fissures and screes of mountains. It was first recorded from Slieve Binnian in 1808 by Templeton. It is now only found in the Mourne Mountains, at between 364-517m. There have been only four sites recorded since 1955. Losses of this species may be for agricultural and climatic reasons. These pressures remain and this species is vulnerable.

A scarce annual native found growing on exposed wet soft sediment or in shallow water at the edge of loughs and in canals. It was first recorded in 1836 in the canal at Newry. The current condition of the canal renders it unlikely that *Elatine hydropiper* could have survived in it except perhaps in Newry and at Ellis's Gut. In the late 1980s, the N.I. Lake Survey indicated that populations in the loughs appeared to be stable. This species could be vulnerable to further losses as has *E. hexandra* e.g. through trampling.

Indeed, this subspecies has only recently undergone a name change from Rosa caesia ssp. glauca to R. c. ssp. vosagiaca. Add a lack of critical interest in roses by the botanists who worked the county between c. 1920 and 1970, and who lumped R. caesia, R. canina and their hybrid (R. x dumalis) into a R. canina aggregate. Even now, R. caesia is probably underrecorded. It is probably not rare in the county, although its hybrid with R. canina sensu stricto (R. x dumalis) is probably much commoner. There are further complications, because up until fairly recently the name R. dumalis was used as a synonym of R. caesia. The earliest records of R. caesia (under the names R. afzeliana or R. glauca) date from 1894-96. These records have not been entered into the CEDaR database, but seem to be included in the New Atlas of the British & Irish Flora (Preston et al. 2002). The editors omitted more recent records from the Atlas, as specimens had not been confirmed by them. Waddell frequently recorded the hybrid R. x dumalis at the same sites at the same times as R. caesia.

It is mainly found in the area around Belfast and is spreading. It is a deliberate introduction at some of the sites listed below.

At present, the population of this species appears at low risk at Killard, Tyrella and Murlough where it is protected.
