Name Poa trivialis Rough meadowgrass

Habitat/Range



This is a widespread grass of <u>hedge</u> bottoms, open <u>woodlands</u>, dampish <u>neutral grasslands</u> waste ground and <u>arable</u> field edges It can also be found along verges and banks of watercourses as well as in <u>marshes</u> and around ponds. It is generally a lowland species but can be found up to 1,065 m in Scotland. Although a common native it is also widely distributed through its inclusion in seed mixes.

Identification A loosely tufted and stoloniferous perennial grass with erect culms up to 100 cm tall, the sheaths are usually rough to the touch. Leaves are hairless and pleated with a keeled tip; ligules are noticeably long (4 -10 mm) and pointed, in contrast with smooth meadowgrass. The quite large panicles are erect to slightly nodding with clusters of delicate spreading branches and fine spikelets.
