


Very rare montane species - 10 hectads in Ireland

Locally common on Ben Bulben plateau






Moss campion at Dunaff Head


Discovered by Charles Moore in 1839




Last seen by H.C. Hart, 1890's – grows 'in a place that some people would not care to linger over'

















Altitude only c. 80 to 100m and no other Arctic-alpine species in the vicinity.
