- 39 attendees (5 from England)








Connemara

- Visited 12 hectads, 5400 records












Parentucellia viscosa (Yellow Bartsia)






Jacobaea vulgaris (Senecio jacobaea) subsp. dunensis (Rayless Common Ragwort)






Eriocaulon aquaticum (Pipewort)








Lithospermum officinale (Common Gromwell)

Rhynchospora fusca (Brown Beak-sedge)


Eriophorum gracile (Slender Cottongrass)

= Carum verticillatum(Whorled Caraway)









Apium graveolens (Wild Celery)
