



## Channel Islands' Top 10



**Daisy** 

A familiar white and yellow flower found in lawns and grassy places.

Similar flowers: Feverfew. **Mexican Fleabane** 



Gorse

Yellow flowers that smell of coconut when in the sun. Has the classic flower shape of a member of the pea family.



**Smooth Hawk's-beard** 

Tall plant with Dandelionlike flowers and leaves that 'clasp' the stem.



**Annual Meadow Grass** 

A tiny grass found on pavements, gravel, bases of lampposts etc., We recommend you submit a photo of this one!



**Groundsel** 

Yellow flowers, sometimes in a cluster, with no petals. Leaves jagged. Weedy places and pavements.



**Red Campion** 

Hive-petalled pink flowers and leaves in opposite pairs.



**Smooth Sow-thistle** 

A dandelion look-alike but usually much taller and the stem leaves have pointy bases which wrap around the stem.



**Herb Robert** 

Pink 5-petalled flowers and deeply divided fern-like leaves.

It's a bit smelly!



Cat's-ear

Looks similar to a Dandelion but doesn't have a green 'ruff' below the flower, and has very hairy leaves.



Hogweed

Big divided leaves, hairy stems, white umbrellashaped or cauliflower-like flowers.
