



England's Top 10



Daisy

A familiar white and yellow flower found in lawns and grassy places.

Similar flowers: Feverfew, Mexican Fleabane



Dandelion

A yellow flower with jagged leaves found in lawns, grassy places and flowerbeds. There are over 200 species of dandelion in Britain and Ireland.



Groundsel

Yellow flowers, sometimes in a cluster, with no petals. Leaves jagged. Weedy places and pavements.



White Dead-nettle

Leaves heart-shaped and toothed, like a nettle, but with an obvious ring of white flowers. It doesn't sting!



Annual Meadow Grass

A tiny grass found on pavements, gravel, bases of lampposts etc., We recommend you submit a photo of this one!



Yarrow

Lots of tiny white flowers clustered into an umbrella shape. Leaves very feathery.



Petty Spurge

Tiny, green-yellow, sea-anemone-like flowers are cupped by green, leaf-like 'bracts'.

Found in flowerbeds and disturbed ground.



Red Dead-nettle

Leaves heart-shaped and toothed, like a nettle, but with obvious pink flowers. It doesn't sting. Similar flowers: Henbit Dead-nettle



Shepherd's-purse

A cluster of small white flowers, each with four petals; its most distinctive feature are its heart-shaped seed pods.



Gorse

Yellow flowers that smell of coconut when in the sun. Has the classic flower shape of a member of the pea family.
