

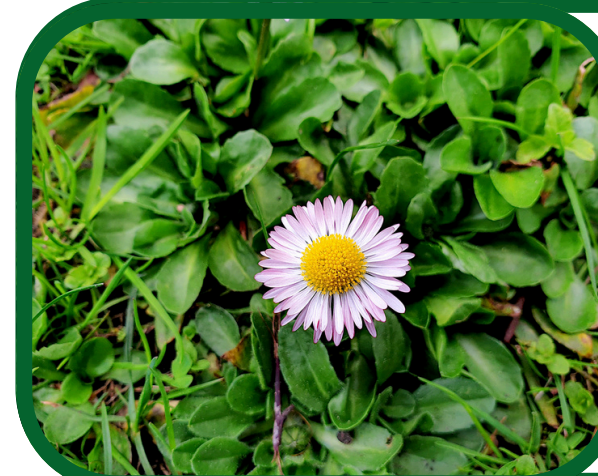


Scotland's Top 10



Gorse

Yellow flowers that smell of coconut when in the sun. Has the classic flower shape of a member of the pea family.



Daisy

A familiar white and yellow flower found in lawns and grassy places. **Similar flowers:** Feverfew, Mexican Fleabane



Annual Meadow Grass

A tiny grass found on pavements, gravel, bases of lampposts etc., We recommend you submit a photo of this one!



Groundsel

Yellow flowers, sometimes in a cluster, with no petals. Leaves jagged. Weedy places and pavements.



Dandelion

A yellow flower with jagged leaves found in lawns, grassy places and flowerbeds. There are over 200 species of dandelion in Britain and Ireland.



Shepherd's-purse

A cluster of small white flowers, each with four petals; its most distinctive feature are its heart-shaped seed pods.



Pineappleweed

Small yellow-green cone-shaped flowers; whole plant smells of pineapple when bruised.



Common Field-speedwell

Flower with four blue petals and hairy 'toothed' leaves.



White Dead-nettle

Leaves like a nettle but with an obvious ring of white flowers. It doesn't sting!



Petty Spurge

Tiny, green-yellow, sea-anemone-like flowers are cupped by green, leaf-like 'bracts'. Found in flowerbeds and disturbed ground.
