

## Wales' Top 10



**Daisy** 

A familiar white and yellow flower found in lawns and grassy places. Similar flowers: Feverfew,

**Mexican Fleabane** 



Gorse

Yellow flowers that smell of coconut when in the sun. Has the classic flower shape of a member of the pea family.



**Lesser Celandine** 

Yellow Buttercup-like flowers with seven to twelve petals and glossy heart-shaped leaves.



**Ivy-leaved Toadflax** 

Lilac flowers and ivy-shaped leaves, grows out of walls and on gravel.



**Primrose** 

Pale yellow flower with a darker centre and crinkly leaves.



**Dandelion** 

A yellow flower with jagged leaves found in lawns, grassy places and flowerbeds. There are over 200 species of dandelion in Britian and Ireland.



**Groundsel** 

Yellow flowers, sometimes in a cluster, with no petals. Leaves jagged. Weedy places and pavements.



**Annual Meadow Grass** 

A tiny grass found on pavements, gravel, bases of lampposts etc., We recommend you submit a photo of this one!



**Petty Spurge** 

Tiny, green-yellow, sea-anemone-like flowers are cupped by green, leaflike 'bracts'. Found in flowerbeds and disturbed ground.



**Red Campion** 

Five-petalled pink flowers and leaves in opposite pairs.
