BSBI Scottish Field Meeting Programme 2018

Friday 8 to Sunday 10 June (Recording) Haddington, East Lothian (v.c.82)

This long weekend meeting (starting on Friday morning) aims to help the Recorder improve Atlas 2020 coverage in East Lothian. We will be based in the old county town of Haddington, which is a conveniently central base. East Lothian is one of the smallest vice-counties and has a rich and varied coastline – with dune systems, marshes, scrub and grassland to the west of North Berwick – and a rockier coastline to the east. The hinterland is largely farmland, with small woodlands, and scattered settlements and gently rises to moorland of The Lammermuir Hills. Saturday 9 to Saturday 16 June (Recording) Carrick Castle, Loch Goil, Argyll (v.c.98)

South Scotland recording week 2018 will be based in a mountainous area of East Cowal, at Carrick Castle on the shores of Loch Goil, NS1994 (OS Explorer sheet 363). The terrain consists largely of steep afforested slopes with some natural woodland, rough hill ground, crags, gorges and rocky shorelines. There are also opportunities for recording along minor roads, forest tracks and paths. The area has been little recorded since 2000 and records are needed for Atlas 2020. Accommodation is available nearby, but places may be limited, and anyone wishing to attend for all or part of the time should contact Angus Hannah.

Saturday 23 June (General)
Strathpeffer, Easter Ross (v.c.106)

Strathpeffer is an attractive small spa town still popular with visitors. the past, such as *Thalictrum minus* (Lesser Meadow-rue), *Dactylorhiza maculata* (Heath Spotted-orchid) and various neophytes.
