Vulpia myuros spread project

Vulpia myuros (Rat's-tail Fescue) is an annual grass that has seen its distribution increase in the past decades and in recent years has also started to appear as a weed in arable fields in most European countries. For a project aiming at better understanding the dynamics of invasion of arable fields by V. myuros, and the relationship between weed and wild populations, we would be interested to find wild populations of V. myuros in the UK. If you know of any populations, information about its location, extent, density and height of plants, the type of habitat, climate, and soil would be welcome. We would be also interested to receive mature seeds (the species should be flowering in June-July) or send us your name and email if you are happy to show us the population and help us collect seeds later in the season.

National Plant Monitoring Scheme

Have you chosen an NPMS square yet? I discovered that the website has a marvellous tool for finding unallocated survey squares. If you haven't signed up yet simply enter a postcode and a distance you're willing to travel (up to 30 miles) on this page and it will generate a map of allocated and unallocated squares. If you see a square you like the look of then you need to sign-up and pick that square for yourself. Consider sharing this with your local recording groups — there are plenty of vacant squares still to choose from.
