Introduction

This Rare Plant Register replaces the one issued in 2014. Updates will be made on an ongoing basis.

Scope

Records up until the end of 2019 on the BSBI database were used for the charts in this document. I have not included *Dryopteris affinis* as the aggregate is not rare or scarce in the county, and changes in nomenclature have not yet settled down. Most recorders have chosen to record as the agg., as identification of species/subspecies is difficult.

Hybrids are not included.

Apomictic groups such as *Taraxacum*, *Hieracium* and *Rubus* are not included as we have few experts and any records need to be confirmed with the referee.

Criteria

Rare means 3 sites or less in VC32.

Scarce means 10 sites or less in VC32.

Not scarce means more than 10 sites in VC32, but included because the species was formerly considered as rare or scarce, or is on the Red List for England or the UK.

Native means a plant which has been growing in Britain, usually for many thousands of years, without being either accidentally or intentionally introduced by man.

Archaeophyte means a naturalised plant believed to have been introduced by man before 1500 AD; it is considered to be naturalised if the population is maintained or increases from year to year.

In the north of the county, *Agrimonia procera* has its stronghold at Wakerley Wood, where it can be found in several spots. It was also found nearby in 2005 on the road verge between Spanhoe Wood and Wakerley Wood. The other site with recent records is Hazelborough Wood, near Silverstone. Two records are from or near a disused railway line, at Farthinghoe Nature Reserve and not far away near Cockleyhill Farm. A little further south, near Charlton, it was found on a road verge. High Wood and Meadow is a Wildlife Trust BCN reserve, to the south of Daventry.

There were only 5 sites in the county in the previous date class, so the species may be increasing. it would be well worth looking closely at any particularly tall plants of Agrimony on road verges or at the edges of woodland rides. The species may have disappeared from Salcey Forest, where it was last seen in 1987.

This orchid, while strictly not scarce, is actually present in low numbers at each site. The best site¹ is apparently Dungee Corner Meadow, but we have no records from here since 2010. The sites are well-spread across the county and include base-rich, neutral and acidic sites, although the species is supposed to prefer calcareous grassland. The plant at Newnham Hill has been relocated, the success of this is not known. At the most northerly site, Southorpe Meadow, it is only just hanging on. Not included in ⁴.

There are numerous records for *Aquilegia vulgaris* but those shown above are the only ones likely to be native. Most villages seem to feature naturalised plants or clear garden escapes. The sites shown are geographically close and mainly calcareous, but there are naturalised plants present in all of them, so there is no certainty about their origin. Records from Wakerley and Fineshade woods may also refer to the native type, but this is not indicated on the record so they have been excluded.
