



- We are (I am!) very grateful to SNH, RBGE, and the BSBI and you, its members and donors!










Botanical Society of the British Isles in SCOTLAND

The BSBI in Scotland is dedicated to getting people involved in recording our wild plants. The society supports a countrywide recording network. This is done through a number of ways and YOU can get involved.



Members cover a spectrum, from the professional botanist to family groups being out in the field... plants!



BOTANICAL SOCIETY OF BRITAIN & IRELAND

Promoting the study, understanding and enjoyment of British & Irish wild plants since 1836.

Our members record and map which plants grow where; BSBI provides data and analysis to academia, conservation bodies and policy-makers.

Our atlases of the British & Irish flora broke new ground in 1962 and again in 2002.

Atlas 2020's interactive maps will show the distributions of native and introduced plants. It will analyse how the British & Irish flora is changing and help inform future conservation.
