


BSBI IRISH FIELD PROGRAMME 2018

SAT 5th to TUE 8th MAY – Wicklow (v.c.H20), Meath (v.c.H22), North Tipperary (v.c.H10) & Monaghan (v.c.H32)

THUR 10th & FRI 11th MAY; SAT 12th & SUN 13th MAY – WESTMEATH – LOUGH OWEL AREA (v.c. H23)

This event consists of two separate two-day Charophyte ID courses, lead jointly by two leading experts, and put on with significant support from National Parks & Wildlife Service, as well as Inland Fisheries Ireland. Full details will be announced soon, and booking will be essential. There are likely to be both field and indoor elements. SUN 13th MAY – WEXFORD – CURRACLOE DUNES (v.c. H12)

This will be a meeting with a theme on *Viola* and other dune species. The <u>BSBI Viola Handbook</u> may come in handy! SAT 19th & SUN 20th MAY - SOUTH KERRY - IVERAGH PENINSULA (v.c. H01)

This outing will focus on the mountainous, inaccessible interior of the Iveragh peninsula. On Saturday, the area south of Glenbeigh will be visited. A Rough Crew group will visit slopes above Coomacullen Lough, where *Sausurrea alpina* and other rarities need refinding, and another group will explore the lowland areas nearby. Sunday's outing will be to the remote interior of the peninsula near Derriana Lough. FRI 15th to SUN 17th JUNE – EAST DONEGAL – INISHOWEN AREA (v.c. H34)

A range of under-recorded areas in the Inishowen peninsula will be visited with the aim to record for Atlas 2020. There will be a number of diverse habitats (bog, heath, upland and coastal) to explore. Each day we will divide into a number of smaller groups to maximize coverage. On Saturday morning we will visit some diverse wet, orchid-rich pasture and scrub at Wolfhill (home of Hugh Sheppard) with the aim of Atlas 2020 recording. In the afternoon we will explore old clay pit tailings nearby. On Sunday morning we will visit a small woodland at Killeshin Reservoir, and in the afternoon, Rossmore for peatland habitats and great views over the Barrow floodplain. FRI 13th to SUN 15th JULY - WEST GALWAY - INISHBOFIN ISLAND (v.c. H16)

Inishbofin is a beautiful island located 5km off the west coast of Co. Galway. The main habitats are dry heath and seminatural grassland, with rocky ground also frequent. The island has been reasonably well recorded in the recent past, however there are a number of rarer species such as *Tuberaria guttata* and *Eriocaulon aquaticum* which require confirmation. SAT 21st & SUN 22nd JULY – ANTRIM – CAUSEWAY COAST (v.c. H39)

The aim of this meeting is to record in two spectacular north-coast hectads which have been under-recorded since 2000. On Saturday, we will follow the long-distance coastal path from Dunseverick to the Giant's Causeway. On Sunday, we will visit the White Rocks and Ramore Head.
